All Entries must be received by March 7, 2011

General Requirements

The competition is open to all Arizona Chapter AGC general contractor firms in good standing. All parties of a joint venture MUST be dues paying ARIZONA chapter AGC members.

Nominations for the 2010 Build Arizona awards must be submitted by the principals or officers of the applying firms, or with their permission.

Awards will be considered for new construction and renovation work completed in 2010; awards will be presented for both public work and private work, in these categories.

Under 10 Million:

- ❖ Heavy/Industrial Construction
- ❖ Highway Construction
- ❖ Municipal/Utilities Construction

Over 10 Million:

- ❖ Heavy/Industrial Construction
- ❖ Highway Construction
- ❖ Municipal/Utilities Construction

Entry Fee: \$150.00

Every Entry Must Include

The completed nomination form and completed project profile sheets.

A one-page summary of WHY the project should receive a BUILD ARIZONA award.

A narrative of the project explaining how the entry meets each of the following criteria:

Note: No more than two or three paragraphs on each criterion, with a maximum of 5 pages.

- ❖ Meeting the challenges of a difficult job.
- ❖ Excellence in project management
- ❖ Contractor's innovation in construction technique or materials
- ❖ Sensitivity to environment and surroundings
- ❖ Excellence in client service
- ❖ Contractor's contribution to the community.

Were there any serious safety incidents on the project? If so, please explain.

All entries must be presented in a binder to keep project information all together. Entries should include photos with the presentation materials. They may also include slides; videos of no more than 8 minutes of coverage; media coverage; letters of commendation and other supplementary material.

Please keep in mind that sophistication of the presentation is not part of the judging process. However completeness in addressing each of the criteria as outlined above is essential.
